How can the European Core Curriculum be implemented at a national level?

Strategy for the national adaptation
The aim is to translate the European Core Curriculum into the existing curriculum structure. This involves a process of consultation with stakeholders, particularly the Ministry of Education, and the development of a national adaptation plan. The plan will be based on the following principles:
